## Happening Now: Alphabet's \$4.75B Power Play: Securing the AI Future

This week, Alphabet (Google) announced a definitive agreement to acquire Intersect, a leader in clean energy and data center infrastructure, for **\$4.75 billion**.

This is the definitive IT story today because it addresses the single biggest bottleneck in the AI race: **Power**.

As generative AI demands unprecedented amounts of electricity, Alphabet is moving from "**buying green energy**" to "**owning the energy infrastructure**."

The deal secures a pipeline of projects expected to deliver **10.8 gigawatts** of power by 2028 - roughly 20 times the Hoover Dam's output.

By acquiring Intersect, Google can now co-locate massive data centers with clean energy plants (as in its current joint project in Haskell County, Texas).

This "energy-first" strategy bypasses aging public grids and ensures Google Cloud remains the dominant platform for energy-hungry AI workloads in 2026 and beyond.

## Corporate AI: Microsoft Launches "Copilot Business" for SMBs

As of December 2025, Microsoft has bridged the gap between personal AI and enterprise-grade power with the launch of **Copilot Business**.

For **\$21.00 per user/month**, SMBs with up to 300 seats can now access the whole "Work IQ" intelligence layer-previous reserved for larger corporations.

This rollout includes **Agent Mode** for Word and Excel, allowing users to choose between **OpenAI and Anthropic (Claude)** reasoning models for complex data analysis.

Additionally, a new **Employee Self-Service Agent** is now generally available, enabling smaller teams to automate HR and IT tasks, like benefits lookups and ticket submissions, directly within the Microsoft 365 app.

This move signals Microsoft's aggressive push to make "Agentic AI" the standard for every professional, regardless of company size.
